1. Decrease the number of animals entering area shelters, through targeted spay/neuter programs, pet retention programs and community education.
2. Increase the number of live animals leaving area shelters, by strengthening our safety net of medical and behavioral intervention.
3. Secure the funding necessary to accomplish these outcomes. Transformative change requires transformative investment – of time, resources, and passionate commitment.
