

LINES OF COMMUNICATION: BREAKDOWN BY CONTACT METHOD

Below is a breakdown of all the modes of contact available to foster volunteers. When in doubt, call the main Foster Line at 919-630-9680. For after hour questions that may or may not be an emergency, please text first and than call if no response within 30 minutes. All non-emergency questions, please email foster@spcawake.org as priority is always given to time sensation, medical or behavior concerns.
